Ash Wednesday, 14 February: Lent begins this coming Wednesday and will be marked with two services of Holy Communion. At 10am the order will follow the Book of Common Prayer, and at 7.30pm it will follow Common Worship. Both services will include the Imposition of Ashes. This is a good opportunity to mark the beginning of the season of penitence, reflection and discipline, so do join us if you can.

**Lent Resources:** Lent is a good opportunity to reflect upon our Christian journey and to grow closer to God. To help us do this, the Archbishops are recommending the booklet 'Live Lent' which provides a brief daily reading, reflection and prayers based on John's Gospel. Copies are available after the 10.30am Sunday service, cost £3, and thereafter from the shop. If enough of us take advantage of this resource, it will help us to listen to God as we consider where he may be leading us as a parish.

**Lent Discussion : Valuing Our Vision.** On Wednesday evenings between 21 February and 21 March the Vicar will be leading a series of discussions based on the five headings of the Minster's Vision Statement (see the website if this is unfamiliar!). This is intended to help us think about what it means to be part of Christ's church in this place, and to reflect on the challenges and opportunities we face at this time.
