### Matters discussed and decided included:

### **Old Fund Delegation of Powers**

The PCC agree to delegate powers and responsibilities each year to the trustees of the Old Fund. This authorises and gives responsibility to the trustees to carry out repairs and maintenance to the structure of Beverley Minster. This does not include other buildings such as the Parish Hall and Peter Harrison Room but just the Minster fabric. A formal process authorises this.

### **Faculty and Licence Application process**

A memorial plaque is now in place for Alan Spedding. If you haven't seen that yet it is placed in the North Quire Aisle on the left near to the level access exit.

Six further pinnacles on the South Nave High Roof were in need of repair and restoration and it was agreed that a Faculty application be processed to allow that to go ahead. In addition Nave Ridge repairs continue but a Faculty application was needed to authorise additional work to the Quire and Retro Quire Nave Ridge.

## Staffing

Head Virger - We were delighted to report that Robyn Cleveland had taken up her post as Head Virger and was settling in to her new job at the Minster. The PCC all wish her the very best and hope she finds the Minster an enjoyable, supportive church family to be part of.

Assistant Virger - Interviews for the new assistant virger have taken place and it is hoped that Robyn will have a full team alongside her in the near future.

Assistant Organist – We were delighted to note that Ian Seddon had decided that following his recent illness and surgery that he has now fully recovered and would like to stay as Assistant Organist.

## **Visitor Ministry - Beverley Minster Welcomers**

Further to an independent survey of Welcomers it was decided to maintain burgundy as the Welcomers chosen colour for fleeces. However, the provision of grey fleeces would be available to staff and others. The Welcomers will therefore be clearly recognisable for visitor enquiries.

## Youth and Children

The experience Pentecost teaching and prayer stations in the Minster was hugely successful and welcomed the Minster Primary School children, who through story telling were helped to understand what happened on the day of Pentecost and what that means for us today as Christians.

## **Vision Strategy**

Discipleship – The  $3^{rd}$  Pilgrim course starts on June 7 with a further course planned in the autumn. Do try it out.

Visitors and Welcome – Steve George heading the Discovery Team and the first of the planned events would take place on the 10 June 16 in the afternoon starting at 5.30pm.

The Try Praying booklet - The booklet had been taken by each member of the PCC and by a show of hands most had passed those on to friends and neighbours. It was hoped that the booklets would continue to wend their way around our parish and beyond to encourage prayer and faith in Christ.

### **Baptism and Confirmation**

John of Beverley was celebrated with the first 10.30 Baptism and Confirmation service together since 2008. Jeremy said it was a shame more did not attend and wondered if the 10k cycle ride impacted on the numbers who came. There was one baptism and 9 candidates were confirmed (including six young people, four of whom were choristers). The service was thoroughly enjoyed by everyone who attended and we were privileged to have Bishop Alison baptise and confirm the candidates. This is a time to welcome and support new communicants into our congregation and Jeremy asked that everyone pray for growth in discipleship with Christ for each new communicant amongst us.
