

Sermon Title: Remembrance Sunday

- **Pastoral Occasion:** Supporting Those Affected by War
 - Armistice Day: A time for national bereavement, quiet reflection, and support for those scarred by war.
 - Recognizing physical and mental scars of veterans, showing pastoral care for their communities.
- **Broader Purpose of Remembrance Sunday:** Gratitude for Peace
 - Beyond remembering, giving thanks for peace in our lives, society, and the world.
 - Acknowledging the rarity of peace in the face of global conflicts.

Discussion Points / Points to Ponder

5. **Finding Purpose Amidst Adversity:** Reflecting on the veteran's story, how can personal adversity sometimes lead to a deeper understanding of faith and a sense of purpose?
6. **Living as Citizens of a Peaceful Kingdom:** In what ways can we actively live out our identity as children of God, promoting peace and unity in a troubled world?

Alternative Questions:

2. Reflecting on the sermon, why is peace highlighted as the central theme for gratitude on Remembrance Sunday? How does the current global landscape impact our appreciation of peace?

4. What are the obstacles or challenges faced by individuals or communities in embracing love and unity over division, especially in times of political, social, or cultural tension?
5. In Isaiah's prophecy, a vision of future peace is presented. How does this vision of a peaceful future resonate with the world today, and what role can individuals play in fostering this future?
6. The story of the veteran's journey toward faith and peace amidst the horrors of war raises questions about finding purpose in adversity. How can faith or a sense of identity help individuals navigate and find peace amidst personal struggles or traumatic experiences?
