- Introduction
 - Positioned to see baptismal candidates, Choristers Sophia and Skye.
 - Focus on the symbolism of water in baptism.
- Water as Essential for Life
 - Drinking water is necessary for survival; all life needs water.
 - Water sustains physical life by hydrating our bodies.
- Water as a Means of Cleansing
 - Used for washing away impurities and contaminants.
 - Symbolizes the cleansing of sin and spiritual purification in baptism.
- Water as a Source of Enjoyment and Danger
 - Provides fun and recreation, like swimming and water fights.
 - Can be dangerous if not handled properly (e.g., drowning).
- Water as a Source of Comfort
 - Used to keep warm (e.g., hot water bottles, central heating).
 - Used to stay cool (e.g., refreshing drinks, ice cubes).
- Water as Transformative
 - Transforms ingredients (e.g., pasta, tea).
 - Essential for growth (e.g., germinating seeds).
- Comparison to the Holy Spirit
 - Holy Spirit sustains spiritual life, bringing new life and God's presence.
 - Cleanses from sin, offering forgiveness and mercy.
 - Brings joy and excitement, but also convicts and guides towards change.
 - Transforms believers, helping them grow into the likeness of Jesus and their true selves.

 - In baptism, the Holy Spirit fills with love, forgives sins, and leads in spiritual growth.

Questions

4. In what ways can the Holy Spirit be both a source of joy and a convicting presence in our lives, akin to how water can be fun but also dangerous?
 - Explore the dual nature of the Holy Spirit's influence, bringing both joy and a call to repentance.
5. How does the Holy Spirit transform and change believers, making them more like Jesus while also helping them become their true selves?
 - Consider the process of spiritual growth and transformation that occurs through the Holy Spirit, using examples from scripture or personal testimonies.
6. Reflect on the communal aspect of experiencing the Holy Spirit, especially during events like baptism and Pentecost. How can the church community support and encourage each other in this journey?
 - Discuss the role of community in nurturing and witnessing the work of the Holy Spirit in each other's lives, particularly during significant spiritual milestones.
