

Learning and Engagement Officer, Beverley Minster

Beverley Minster wishes to appoint a Learning and Engagement Officer to develop and deliver a range of learning focused activities designed to engage a wide and diverse audience in the story of sanctuary at Beverley Minster

This is a part time post (equivalent 3 days per week) for 24 months and provides opportunities for flexible working. The salary for this post is £17,000 p.a. for a 2 year fixed contract.

The post is funded jointly by The National Lottery Heritage Fund and the Friends of Beverley Minster. Reporting to the Project Manager, and working closely with the Minster's Associate Vicar, the Project Board, church staff and volunteers, the Learning and Engagement Officer will deliver the key objectives of the project including to: develop an inclusive audience development strategy to engage new audiences; deliver ways of interpreting the building, its role, story and heritage as part of that audience development strategy relating to the theme of sanctuary; implement inclusive learning opportunities and resources for adults, families and children; develop links with a wide range of community groups to raise the profile of Beverley Minster and inform the learning and engagement programme; manage liaison with schools, colleges and non-formal learning providers; and implement those aspects of the 'Beverley Minster – Place of Sanctuary' Activity Plan (part of the NLHF project) which relate to community groups, families, schools, and learning, with particular reference to the delivery of the events, heritage and learning programme outlined in the Activity Plan.
