

The Minster gives to costs for training leaders, publishing and facilitating groups in **"The Esther Project"**: *Helping young women to be beautiful in Christ and to take a stand for God in their generation.*

The Esther Project equips believers around the world to make disciples of Christ among young women aged 15–25. Now, more than ever, young women are easily "discipled" by the world and their culture. They are vulnerable to confusion and experiences that can wound them, put them at risk or drag them into spiritual darkness. The Esther Project prays that God will pour out his Spirit so that young women today will come to a saving faith, find their identity in Christ and walk whole, in his light.



A book of Bible studies, life questions and prayer guide (pictured left and right), has been printed for young women to use in small groups or one-on-one. Leaders pray to make loving, safe spaces in homes, churches, schools and universities where young women can connect the word of God with the real concerns of their lives. There they are supported and helped to pray in authentic, transforming relationship with Jesus.



The Esther Project coordinates, trains, encourages and prays for leaders in various African countries. It

currently has books in Tanzania, Kenya, Uganda, Cameroon and DR Congo. Other countries in different continents are waiting to have the book for ministry to young women.

The Bible study book is currently being prepared in English for developed countries and in Spanish for use in Latin America (pictured right). The plan is to make the book available to download along with guidelines for leaders.
