Exploring Spirituality Group: All are welcome to attend a new fortnightly group meeting in St Katherine's Chapel in the Minster from 11am - 12noon. A Knife In The Heart - The Scottish Invasions Of Yorkshire In The 14th Century: All are welcome and free to attend a one hour talk with time for questions and discussion in the Peter Harrison Room from 7pm - 9pm on Tuesday 16th July by Marcus Ramshaw who is currently writing a book on medieval Beverley for publication in 2025. In 1322 King Robert I of Scotland lead his most daring raid deep into the heart of Yorkshire, Beverley had to pay £400 - about 4 million in todays money, to save itself from being burnt down, King Robert of Scotland would raid as far south as Doncaster and his highly successful attack would lead to the first ever deposition and murder of an English king, Edward II in 1327. Please come and hear a description of these remarkable events and if possible let Lauren or the parish office know to help with seating arrangements. Either way you are warmly invited.
