Lent Resources: Lent is a good opportunity to reflect upon our Christian journey and to grow closer to God. To help us do this, the Archbishops are recommending the booklet 'Live Lent' which provides a brief daily reading, reflection and prayers based on John's Gospel. Copies are available after the 10.30am Sunday service, cost £3, and thereafter from the shop. If enough of us take advantage of this resource, it will help us to listen to God as we consider where he may be leading us as a parish.
