Eco Tip for July: Looking after wildlife in the heat: Times of drought and dryness can be dangerous for wildlife. Provide water for birds and insects - put a dish of water out to help wildlife stay hydrated. Insects, small mammals, birds, and even badgers, foxes, and deer could benefit. A stone in a plant saucer helps bees to perch and drink without drowning. These small actions make a big difference and are just some of the ways we can live out our calling to care for God's creation. Beverley Minster and Daughter Churches External Mission Partners: During the month of July please pray for the work of St. Joseph's hospital in the DRC. Give thanks for the dedicated medical team at the hospital. Pray that God would protect everyone at the hospital from contracting the Ebola virus which is rife in other areas of the country and spreading rapidly. Pray for effective vaccines to be discovered and efficient countermeasures to be established. Pray for mothers giving birth in difficult or unsuitable circumstances. Pray for the maintenance of an adequate water supply to the hospital. Pray for an end to the war in Eastern DRC and the establishment of a lasting peace. Although the fighting and the resultant human suffering is taking place far away from St Josephs, its effects are deeply damaging to the entire country.
