**Revision of the Electoral Roll 2024:** The electoral roll update window ends today TODAY. This is an opportunity to remove names that no longer qualify, to update addresses and most importantly to enter new names on the Roll. There is a table in the north aisle with slips for deletions and address changes. There are forms for new enrolments. Slips and enrolment forms should be posted in the yellow box provided.

The Minster bells will not be ringing for the next 6 weeks whilst major restoration work is carried out. This is the first major work on the bells since they were installed in 1901, some of the original parts have now come to the end of their working life and need to be replaced. The 7th bell has been lifted out of position so that the headstock could be removed which means the quarter chimes will be missing a note for the next few weeks. The good news is that Great Johns strike hammer will be refitted in the next couple of weeks after major restoration work and will be striking the hour again. The Friends of Beverley Minster very kindly agreed to fund both of these major restoration projects, without their help the PCC would not be able to carry such work. Reevaluate your journeys: explore walking or cycling options, or modify your route to include some form of active travel, i.e. disembark a stop early and complete the remaining part of your journey on foot, indulge in a leisurely stroll, or opt for a bike ride along a cyclist-friendly route. Consider connecting with your local Ramblers or cycling group for shared experiences. Use the extra steps or the changed travel arrangements as a prompt to pray for God's creation, nature's preservation and the reduction in fossil fuel usage.
