Using the classic Julia Donaldson book *Superworm* and the incredible hard work of our team of volunteers, we welcomed 125 children and 87 adults through the doors of the Minster and created a space of fun, wonder, family and surrounded it with our and God's love. It is always noted by people in person on the day, on social media afterwards and through conversations with longtime attendees how relaxed and welcoming the Minster is to them. More than that, they find it a place of family and a space steeped in God's presence, where they can encounter Him. We're running our next event on Friday 30th August. At Beverley Minster and the Daughter Churches, Who Are Our External Partners? We have 12 key partners – Beverley Schools Christian Trust (BSCT), The Richardson's (Esther Project), CMS, Jacob's Well, Christian Service Unit – India, Christ Church Norris Green, Compassion UK, The Church Army, The Bible Society, Open Doors, St Joseph's Hospital and Hope into Action. Hanging From The Gallows Tree - Law And Order In Medieval Beverley 1272-1534:

Like today, the people of medieval Beverley were deeply concerned with law and order. What was the crime rate? How serious was it and how did the authorities respond? Examining cases of murder, rioting kidnapping, rape, major theft as well as minor crimes from poaching to burglary; this talk will surprise and reveal a remarkable response in legal developments. As an inland international port, Beverley merchants were often involved in both piracy and smuggling, often triggering international disputes which are also discussed. A one hour talk with questions and answers by Marcus Ramshaw in the Parish Hall from 7pm - 9pm on Wednesday 4th September. All welcome. Admission Free. It would be helpful with seating if you let Jonathan, Lauren or the parish office know you might be coming but you can just turn up on the day.

An Hour of Prayer: Our next hour of prayer will be on Monday 5th August, between I Iam and I2 noon, in the prayer space in the Minster.
