

St. Peter's Woodmansey Annual Report

Elections

The A.G.M. will be held on Tuesday 10th March 2020. All the officials and committee will be elected after the generation of this report.

Finances

The 2019 final accounts have been forwarded to the Beverley Minster treasurer. The account showed a decrease in net balances of £1,521. (This is made up of an decrease of fixed assets - £1,048 - depreciation, a reduction in current assets of £400 – bank - and an increase liabilities “accounts payable” £73).

Fabric

Generally the fabric of the building is in good repair. The internal has been painted. Nick Teed from York Glaziers Trust has carried out an extensive assessment of the stain glass windows. The necessary repair work can be done in situ but requires scaffolding. Faculty application is being prepared to support grant applications to help fund the repair work.

Organ

Repairs and tuning are also ongoing.

Mission Action Plan

We continue to support the school in all its activities. The school has held services in St Peter's at Easter, Harvest time and at Christmas. The attendance numbers at these services have increased over 2018. They have planned an Easter service at St Peter's. 2020. For the last two terms a weekly lunch club has taken place, which is lead by Karen Eyre from BSCT and a member from the parish. In April the first quarterly event is planned with the schools PTFA.

A small dedicated team from the Minster have continued to carry out “Prayer visiting” in Woodmansey. In 2019 3 prayer visiting events took place and included both of the new build communities where the process was particularly welcomed. Publicity fliers continue to be distributed throughout the village for major activities during the year.

In the Summer there was an organ recital by Robert Poyser.

The Remembrance service was well attended by local parish councillors.

Christmas activities this year included carol singing around the village, carols at the Warton Arms, St Peter's carol service and Christmas morning service. All events were well attended. This year the Yorkshire Country Women actively participated in the Carol service.
