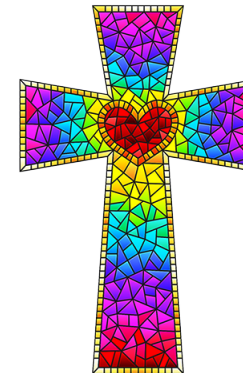


SARAH JOHNSON
