

St Leonard's, Molescroft: Annual Report

St Leonard's has continued to open each Saturday for one hour for private prayers, with an average attendance of 12. This has proved very worthwhile, being able to have the church open and to welcome some new people.

Each month we hold two Holy Communion services back to back on the same Sunday, with an average attendance of 46 in total.

Our two Remembrance week prayer mornings had an attendance of 54, plus two young friends.

Easter Day services had an attendance of 43.

We continue our pastoral care, which is very important, during what has been a very lonely time for many people because of Covid restrictions.
